

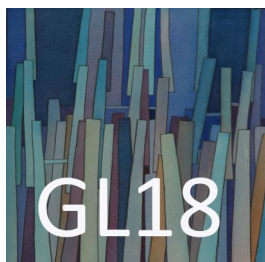

Jo Ivey Boufford, MD, is President of The New York Academy of Medicine. Dr. Boufford is Professor Emeritus of Public Service, Health Policy and Management at the Robert F. Wagner Graduate School of Public Service and Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at New York University School of Medicine. She is Co-Director of the National Program Office of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Health and Society Scholars Program. She served as Dean of the Robert F. Wagner Graduate School of Public Service at New York University from June 1997 to November 2002. Prior to that, she served as Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary for Health in the U.S.

Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) from November 1993 to January 1997, and as Acting Assistant Secretary from January 1997 to May 1997. While at HHS, she served as the U.S. representative on the Executive Board of the World Health Organization (WHO) from 1994-1997.

Blane Dessy is a Deputy Associate Librarian at the Library of Congress with a focus on Planning and Project Management in Library Services. He is the former Executive Director of FEDLINK, the Federal Library Information Network and was instrumental in establishing the FedGrey Working Group. In 2010, Blane delivered the Keynote Address at the 12th International Conference on Grey Literature. He has served on a number of Program Committees for the

International Conference Series on Grey Literature and has been instrumental in hosting this conference series at the Library of Congress in 2009, 2011, and 2014. Prior to his appointment at the Library of Congress, Blane had been Director of Libraries at the United States Department of Justice and the first Executive Director of the National Library of Education. Blane came to the Federal Government after working as a State Librarian, Deputy State Librarian, library consultant, and public library director.
